Gettysburg
Pennsylvania

Gettysburg was the site of the largest and bloodiest single battle ever waged during the American Civil War, resulting in over 51,000 soldiers killed, wounded, captured or missing. The Soldiers' National Cemetery at Gettysburg was dedicated on November 19, 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln delivered his immortal Gettysburg Address. On February 11, 1895, congressional legislation was signed to establish Gettysburg National Military Park as a memorial dedicated to the armies that fought this great battle.

Package and Itinerary

Day One

- 6:00 am - Arrive at the school. Be sure to eat a hearty breakfast at home and bring snacks for the ride.
- 6:30 am - Buses depart for Gettysburg, PA.
- 11:00 am - **Comfort Stop/Bag lunch from home on route actual time is approximate. Other comfort stops to be made as needed.**
- 12:30 pm - Arrive in Gettysburg, PA. Your first stop will be to experience the American Civil War Museum.
- 2:30 pm - Depart for the Soldiers National Cemetery and a self guided walking tour of this hallowed ground.
- 5:30 pm - It's time to depart for the Hotel, check-in, freshen up and get ready for dinner and a busy evening of ghost hunting.
- 6:30 pm - **Depart for a buffet dinner at General Pickett's Restaurant.**
- 7:30 pm - This evening we combine hauntings with history as we head over to rendezvous with our well versed guides.
- 10:00 pm - Buses return to the Hotel.
- 10:30 pm - Lights out for the night. Big day tomorrow.

- 8:00 am - Check out of hotel. Depart for the National Military Park to Meet your official Licensed Gettysburg Battlefield step-on Guide for a complete tour and colorful narrative on the sights, monuments, and history of historic battle
